Leading Off

Tonight, the Kettleers visit the Hyannis Harbor Hawks in game two of the first round of the CCBL Playoffs in a best-of-three series. Cotuit won the season series over Hyannis 3-2-1 and captured the Patriot Cup. Hyannis leads the series 1-0 and Cotuit needs a win to stay alive.

Looking Back

Cotuit fell to the Hyannis Harbor Hawks 9-4 in game one of the CCBL West semifinals. Ryan Ignoffo hit his first home run as a Kettleer in the loss.

Playoff Time

Cotuit and Hyannis meet in the CCBL Playoffs for the first time since the 2015 season. Hyannis won both games of the series to advance to the next round. 2022 marks the return to the eight-team playoff after only four teams qualified in 2021.

Up Next

The winner of this series between Cotuit and Hyannis will advance to the West Finals to take on the winner of the series between Bourne and Falmouth.

Late-Season Hardware

Two Kettleers picked up a couple late-season awards prior to last night's game. Tommy Troy was awarded as the Outstanding Pro Prospect and Cam Schuelke was awarded as the Outstanding Relief Pitcher.

Success in June

Cotuit's 13 wins in June are tied with four other teams for the most wins in the season's first month in league history. The 2002 Kettleers also won 13 games. Also included are 1996 Wareham and 1994 Orleans. All of this info comes via Bruce Hack of Sportstats.

400 Club

Mike Roberts captured his 400th career win on June 13th at Falmouth. He is one of five CCBL managers all-time with 400 or more wins and Roberts sits fifth in wins all-time.

Head Coach Mike Roberts



Coach Roberts, has led the Kettleers to the 2010, 2013 and 2019 Cape Cod Baseball League Championship, claiming the Arnold Mycock Trophy. In 2012, the team won the President's Trophy for the best regular season record in the league at 30-14. This was the first time the Kettleers had reached 30 wins under Coach Roberts' leadership.

From 1978 through 1998, Roberts was the head coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Then he went on to UNC-Asheville, where he coached in the spring of 2000. All totaled, Roberts' UNC teams made nine NCAA post-season and two College World Series appearances. Five times his teams captured the ACC Regular Season Championship and four times the ACC Tournament Championship. Ten of Roberts' former players have been first round draft picks. Sixteen of his former players at UNC have played in Major League Baseball. His greatest individual coaching success is his own son, Brian Roberts, the two time all-star 2nd baseman who played for the Baltimore Orioles and New York Yankees.

Walt Weiss, who played for Coach Roberts at UNC-CH went on to become the American League Rookie of the year in 1988, manage the Colorado Rockies and is currently the bench coach for the 2021 World Series champion Atlanta Braves. Several former players are collegiate head coaches (Mark Kingston, South Carolina; Chad Holbrook, College of Charleston; Todd Interdonato, Wofford). Some, like Willie Stewart, are assistants, and several others work in professional baseball or are professional baseball athlete's advisors. "I am pleased so many of the excellent student/athletes I have recruited through the years continue to enjoy a career helping young men try to reach their academic, athletic, and career goals."

Every summer in Cotuit the goal is to win a Cape League Championship. We strive to accomplish this goal with mature college student-athletes from around the nation who embrace fundamental practices and love playing at picturesque Elizabeth Lowell Park. Many of the Kettleers players become involved in our wonderful community with activities such as the Cotuit library reading program and the ever-growing Kettleers baseball clinics. The athletes provide excellent leadership to young people during the summer as they are also building close relationships, many which last a lifetime, with their host families.

Prior to managing Wareham to the Western Division regular season title in 2000, Roberts had led Wareham to the same title in 1984. Each of those two seasons, Roberts' Cape League teams led the entire League in stolen bases and continued this tradition with the 2012 Kettleers. In 2000, Roberts' Wareham team tied the Cape League all-time single season stolen base record with 134 stolen bases.

In the off-season, Coach Roberts has studied part-time for his Doctorate in Sports Administration at the University of New Mexico, does base stealing clinics, writes, and produces baseball videos. He has written 2 books on base stealing. The first titled "You Can't Steal Second Base and Keep Your Foot on First!" published in Dec. 2008 and the 2nd book titled "Baserunning" was published in Dec. 2013. He is now working for the Pittsburgh Pirates as well as consulting with many colleges and high schools on base stealing and base running.

Several base stealing videos were filmed at beautiful Elizabeth Lowell Park in Cotuit in 2011 and a hitting video was filmed at Lowell Park in 2012. His son Brian, who led the American League in stolen bases in 2007, contributed to the first book and the DVD which shows clips of Brian stealing bases for the Orioles.

Mike currently works for the Pittsburgh Pirates. He is an adjunct Sports Management professor for Spring Arbor University in Michigan after completing three years as Director of Sports Management at Asbury University in Wilmore, KY. He has consulted for two sports industry training and technologies companies as the Director of Baseball Development for SmartKage in Tyngsborough, MA. He holds a similar role with Athletes' Performance (name is currently TeamExos), driving the Business Development for Baseball with minor league and major league baseball athletes. AP is featured often in publications and on ESPN as the premier athletic training center for Elite Athletes in the USA and around the world.

In Jan. 2014, Coach Roberts was voted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Coaches Hall of Fame and was inducted in Orlando, Florida on Jan. 3, 2015. In January 2009, 2011, 2017 and recently again in January 2022 Coach Roberts was a platform speaker at the annual ABCA convention which hosts around 6,000 coaches.

Coach Roberts daughter, Angie lives in the Dallas area with husband David and boys Tyler and Brock. They have enjoyed visiting Cotuit almost every summer since 2004. His son, Brian lives in Sarasota, FL with wife Diana and boys Jax, Nash, and Cru.

Off day profile: Cam Schuelke came to Cotuit after a round of minigolf

In early June, Cam Schuelke walked into Putter's Paradise, past the white whale fountain that marked the entrance, and redeemed his golf round for one. The circumstances of him being there in the first place were pure luck (and some minigolf skills, too); Schuelke had won a free round from a team-sponsored event when he was training with the Hyannis Harbor Hawks. He had sunk a lucky hole-in-one on the eighteenth hole, granting him a free card. But shortly after his first visit, Hyannis told him that they didn't have a spot for him on their roster. So before making the arduous fifteen hour drive home — made even worse because he never got on the bump for the Harbor Hawks — Schuelke decided to redeem his voucher, alone.

"I was so bored that I went to play by myself," he said. "It was a walk-of-shame type beat."

But after starting the first hole, a father-son duo saw him golfing alone and invited them to join their group. They played a competitive eighteen holes, complete with a tiebreaker at the end. Schuelke emerged with the win though, and he drove away from Putter's Paradise fully believing that he'd never see his minigolf partners again.

A few weeks later, Schuelke arrived in Cotuit, having been offered a temporary contract. Standing in front of baseball ops was his minigolf partner, Peter Flaherty Jr. Unbeknownst to him, he had been playing with the father of the Ketts' scouting director. Peter Flaherty III had learned about the pitcher's departure from his dad, and he kept Schuelke in the back of his mind as the season progressed and the roster shifted around.

"The second we had an open slot, I knew who I was going to call," the younger Flaherty said. "And he's going to close out a championship game for us."

Since being here, Schuelke had been a workhorse for the bullpen. He walked into his first outing and secured the save for the Ketts at Wareham. He proceeded to pitch the next four days, throwing 113 pitches, 74 of them for strikes, without a day off.

The subbie's arm slot allows him to hurl day after day. At 10 years old, he learned from his dad to throw

from both an overhand and underhand arm slot. While he walked into Lowell Park alternating equally between both arm slots, head coach Mike Roberts made it clear at the start that he thought the pitcher was more effective from the lower arm slot. Still, Schuelke occasionally goes to his high arm slot for pitches that the Yarmouth-Dennis announcers coined the Schuelke Special. In his outing at Bourne, he only threw four overhand, three of which were recorded outs. His former school tried to convert him to a strictly submarine arm, an experience he described as "god awful," but it's working out for him on the Cape.

He throws a four seam and two seam fastball, slider and curveball, working on a changeup. But his strength hadn't necessarily been in the pure velocity of his pitches; instead, it's been in the spin of the ball. It has a frisbee-like motion that's deceptive to hitters. He's never been a location guy, instead relying on movement.

"Some guys like to paint the black, they feel like they have to go up and in," Schuelke said. "I've always trusted my movement — that if I throw it, it's going to move too much for you to square up."

There's no magical Schuelke secret for recovery, no silver bullet that allows him to get outs day after day. Schuelke credits ibuprofen and ping pong, which loosens up his arm. Pitching coach Andrew Schriener doesn't have answers for pitcher's quick recovery.

"To be honest, I have no idea," he said. "I think he just likes to pitch. He goes out there, and his arm could be hanging off for all I know."

But Schuelke is nonchalant about it. It's really nothing new to him — in high school, he once threw over 270 pitches in three days.

"Everyone's always like, 'Oh, your arm doesn't hurt at all,' and I have to correct them. I'm like, 'Well, I mean, it does. I just throw. It's not a big deal.'"

Over everything else, his reliability has been a huge asset to the Ketts' bullpen. In five straight days, his pitches still look the same — the only thing that might change is the number of pitches he's available to throw. And he has the stats to show for his efforts; he didn't allow an earned run in his first seven games, and he was credited with the win in three out of his last four appearances. Again and again, he's helped the Ketts stay competitive late in the game.

"He might not be feeling the greatest, but he goes out there and competes," Schriener said. "He takes some of the worry off of the guys' minds, but at the same time, it gives them confidence to say, 'Hey, he's pitching six days in a row, why can't I pitch on two days' rest?'"

His attitude hasn't gone unnoticed with his teammates. "Oh he's the GOAT," Will Jacobsen said after he closed out the game at Harwich. "I still don't know how he does it," catcher Caleb Lomavita said. "I just hope his arm's okay."

Some days, Schuelke's name isn't written on the board that sets the pitching rotation. But in the sixth inning, he'll come walking over to the bullpen coaches. "I'm good to go," he'll say. He's done enough waiting and watching— now, he's just having fun.
